Miss Cochrane's work as a director includes professional stock companies such as the State Theatre of North Carolina and Flat Rock Playhouse, where her work has spanned main stage productions, regional tours, apprentice programs and the Carl Sandburg National Park program. While serving as quest director in Ocala, Florida, she conducted children's workshops and directed theatre for young people while attending her mainstage duties. Her work as an actress includes eight years as a member of the Flat Rock Playhouse, as well as an on-going association with numerous stock and regional companies such as the Tennessee Repertory Theatre.

NIGHTWATCH becomes the latest of a long list of mysteries she has directed for the stage, which includes several Agatha Christie works such as THE MOUSETRAP and TEN LITTLE INDIANS, and the Lindsey and Crouse comedy thriller REMAINS TO BE SEEN. Other genre she has directed include plays and musicals such as FOXFIRE, NO TIME FOR SERGEANTS, and HELLO DOLLY! Among her film credits as an actress are UNSPEAKABLE ACT with Jill Clayburgh, BLACK RAINBOW with Rosanna Arquette, and THE LOOK-ALIKE with Melissa Gilbert.

TICKETS

Tickets are \$7 for general admission; \$5 for senior adults, UAB employees and alumni; \$2 for non-UAB students and children 12 and under; \$1 for UAB students with validated I.D. The Bell Theatre box office opens one hour prior to the performance for at-door sales. Tuesday thru Saturday curtain is at 8pm. On Sunday, for Dance productions, curtain is at 2pm. The box office will close for at-door sales as soon as the production begins. After such time, no one will be admitted without a ticket. LATE SEATING POLICY
