

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Very few scripts written in the last few years have more immediate appeal than STOP KISS. When reading it, people either love it for what the characters *say* or for what the characters *don't* say. I'm in the latter category. The way these people talk *around* what they're trying to communicate, the way they sometimes sabotage their own conversations ... these are keen observations about the truth of human relationships.

Like most other fans of this script I'm also fascinated by the clever way the story is presented. STOP KISS flashes backward and forward through time, alternating between what occurred before The Kiss and what happened afterward. At some point it occurred to me that the entire play seems to take place in Callie's memory. She's trying to make sense of a chain of events, fitting the moments together like pieces of a puzzle --

-- which reminded me of a song called "The Puzzle" by Joanna Agee, one of my favorite living humans. She had recorded it with her group "Vivian's Keeper, " and thanks to Joanna and her worthy partner Adam Bentley, it's their music you hear in this production of STOP KISS. You can find out more about them online at www.vivianskeeper.com, and I hope you will.

Of my long list of people I need to thank, I want to mention two in particular: naturally I give deep thanks to Diana Son, not only for her remarkable script, but for her extremely kind advice on how to handle some particular aspects of the show. And as always, my very deepest thanks to Kinta, who doesn't swerve.
