

Director's Notes

This is a fierce world, a world ruled by violence, a world which is the raw material from which rose the civilization that was Classical Greece. In this world the gods are vengeful and petty, caring and protective, unclear in their prophecies and relentless in fulfilling them—like the people who worship them. It is a world of light and shadow, where neither things nor ideas are what they seem. In such a world, how can we know what is right, what we must do?

Antigone, now the eldest survivor of Oedipus, chooses to bury her brother Polyneices despite her king's decree that, as a traitor to Thebes, he will lie unburied on the battlefield. Can she do otherwise for her kin? Must she risk her life to fulfill her honor?

Creon, King of Thebes upon the deaths of the sons of Oedipus, chooses to punish Polyneices for his treason and to disregard the gods' decree that honor be given to the dead. Can he do otherwise to protect his city? Must he risk ruin to fulfill its honor?

Which of these is right? Or are they both? Or neither? Sophocles, like the Greek seers, does not provide a clear answer. Nor, in our own lives, can we.


There is no happiness where there is no wisdom, No wisdom but in submission to the gods. Proud words are always punished, And proud men, in old age, learn to be wise.
