

The play will be performed without an intermission.

First performed at the Vineyard Theatre in NYC in March 1997, *How I Learned to Drive* enjoyed critical success and a Pulitzer Prize, and firmly established Paula Vogel as the next great playwright of the day. Current Chair of the Playwriting Program at Yale, Vogel has mentored promising playwrights like Lynn Nottage and Sarah Ruhl, whose *Intimate Apparel* and *Eurydice*, respectively, have appeared on the UAB main stage.

How I Learned to Drive draws heavily from the novel Lolita by Vladimir Nabokov as well as theatrical conventions dating back to ancient Greece, such as the inclusion of an omniscient narrator as well as the Greek chorus. Vogel seduces the audience to "go along for a ride they wouldn't ordinarily take, or don't even know they're taking." She wishes for the audience to see controversial issues in a new and non-traditional light. Using the context of learning to drive, the playwright explores themes of manipulation and power. Vogel's intent is to create neither victim nor villain, showing all characters as multi-faceted, intriguing people attempting to reconcile their needs and desires.
