

Dramaturgical Notes

One of the most influential playwrights of the past century, August Wilson is best known for his grand epic The Pittsburgh Cycle: a series of ten plays, each chronicling a different period of the twentieth-century African American history. Chronologically second in the cycle, *Joe Turner's Come and Gone* (1984) explores the socio-cultural changes in the 1911: "When black Americans emigrated from the South to the North they lost certain connections – connections I think we as black Americans need to go back and make. For 200 years we developed a culture in the South and when we moved north we abandoned that and lost our tie to our history" (August Wilson in a 1994 interview).

The colored and colorful characters inhabiting Seth Holly's boardinghouse are struggling to find their place in a transforming nation where slavery has only recently ended and identities are being shaken. Their dilemma is culturally significant: Do we see ourselves as descendants of Americanized slaves or as descendants of free Africa? Which set of cultural traditions should we stick by? The dramatic questions are played through various conflicts: younger generations argue with the older, the Northern diaspora contests the Southern migrants, and modern ideas challenge primitive beliefs. In the words of Bynum, the mystical voodoo priest of the boardinghouse, each character needs to discover his/her personal "song," reconcile with the past, and chart the road to the future.
