

After graduating from UAB Department of Theatre in 2008, Harlan spent six years as a freelance director in New York City, where he directed the world premiere of the New York Times Critic's Pick *Honky* by Greg Kalleres, co-wrote and performed in the critically acclaimed *home/sick* by The Assembly, and directed numerous world premieres with some of the country's most exciting playwrights. Luke has developed new plays at The Public Theater, New York Theater Workshop, Tectonic Theater Project, The New Group, The Kennedy Center, Columbia University, and the O'Neill Theater Center, among others.

Harlan's work has been seen from San Francisco to New York, downtown and Off-Broadway, regionally and internationally at such places as the Old Vic Theatre in London. He attended Yale School of Drama, where he directed over eight productions, including Shakespeare's *The Winter's Tale*, and Thornton Wilder's *The Skin of Our Teeth*, as well as plays by Will Eno, Greg Keller and Tarell Alvin McCraney. Harlan was also the co-artistic director of the Yale Summer Cabaret, Founding Artistic Director of the Brooklyn-based Engine Company No. 11, member of the T.S. Eliot US/UK Exchange, and recipient of the SDC National Directing Award. After graduating with his Master of Fine Arts degree, Harlan was assistant director of the premiere of *The Square Root of Three Sisters* with visionary Russian director Dmitry Krymov.
