

The original production was directed by Fiona Buffini.

Notes on This Production:

The farcical stage comedy "39 Steps" is an entertaining parody of the Alfred Hitchcock film of the same name which appeared in 1935. The plot is one that Hitchcock was attracted to time and time again: Innocent bystander drawn into an international intrigue through mistaken identity. This lone individual is then pitted against a powerful and deadly international spy ring, in this case known as "The 39 Steps", with deadly plot twists and continual crises confronting them through the ever-changing plot.

But the tension is pushed over the top in this comedic entertainment as this adaptation for the stage is a farcical parody of the original film that brings into comic focus the corny acting styles, situations, and stereotypical characters that appear in the original 1935 film. "39 Steps" could be described as a hilarious mash up of Monty Python style comedy with an Alfred Hitchcock spy thriller. Adding to the chaos is that the entire cast of characters is played by only four actors constantly changing costumes and adopting comedic character voices and accents for each new role.

Set with notorious characters, 1930's music and costumes, intrigue, backstabbing (literally!), physical slapstick, hidden references like little easter eggs to other Hitchcock films throughout the script, and a host of delightful classic spy story situations, "39 Steps" is a breathless comedic journey through a nostalgic era. It's a perfect comedic diversion for a cold winter night! Thrills, chills, and a lot of laughs!

Originally a 1915 novel by John Buchan, "39 Steps" became a 1935 film adaptation by Alfred Hitchcock. The concept to turn it into a 4 person stage adaptation was originated by Nobby Dimon and Simon Corble in the mid 1990's. Patrick Barlow formalized the concept into a published script in 2005 and its been a popular stage comedy ever since.
