<b>Please Note:</b> If an individual is unconditionally admitted to this Class A program based on a valid bachelor's level professional educator certification from another state, this individual must hold valid Alabama Class B Professional Educator Certificate <i>before</i> completing this Class A program and subsequently applying for Alabama certification at the Class A level in Collaborative Special Education (K-6).
