

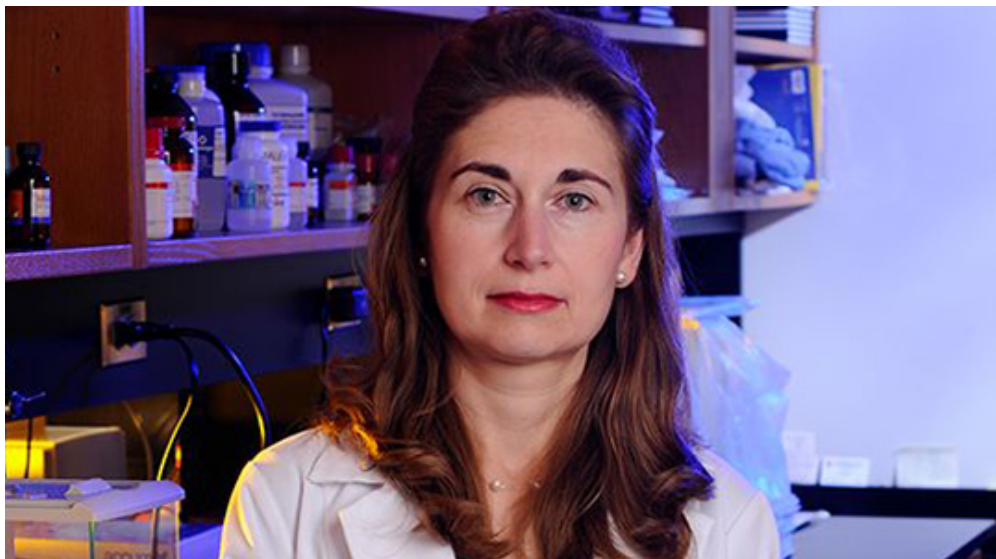

TIXiMED startup successfully completes first-in-human study of novel oral diabetes drug



TIXiMED, Inc., has successfully completed a Phase 1 single ascending dose study of the drug TIX100 in humans, marking a key milestone in the development of a first-of-its kind oral therapy for Type 1 diabetes.

Combo weight-loss drug helps patients shed 20 percent of body weight, study finds

Results from a Phase 3 clinical trial led by W. Timothy Garvey, M.D., published in the *New England Journal of Medicine*, indicate the drug could mark a significant step forward in medical weight management.
