

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

"TEACH DOM," an offering of the DOM Faculty Development
Program, is a longitudinal curriculum designed to enhance
teaching skills for early career clinician educators. The curriculum will be
delivered in a series of small group seminars from February to May 2026.
The focus is on small group teaching, but some aspects will also apply to
didactic teaching (lectures etc.).

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Early career clinician educators (Assistant Professors) involved in inpatient and/or outpatient teaching with learners, including fellows, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.


PROGRAM GOAL:

Enhance Teaching Skills in small group clinical settings (clinic/hospital).

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES: (specifically, the seminars are designed to):

- · Enhance participants' versatility as teachers
- Enhance their ability to analyze clinical teaching using an educational framework
- Provide a forum for collegial exchange about teaching challenges and best practices

PARTICIPANTS AND SELECTION CRITERIA:



- Holds a Primary appointment in DOM
- Has served at least 1 year on UAB DOM Faculty
- Has a rank of Assistant or Associate Professor
- Has a Clinical/Teaching role that involves at least 20% time in small group teaching (two ward/consult months or 1 full day of clinic with learners)
- Priority will be given to those who have not already participated in a formal Faculty Development program on Clinical Teaching (SFDP etc.)
 - Due to limited size of groups, selections will prioritize balanced participation across DOM divisions
 - This program cannot accommodate Fellows at this time





CURRICULUM DETAILS AND DATES:

- FORMAT: Small group (6-8 participants), 8 sessions
- **TIMING**: Thursday 1-3pm (Feb to May 2026)
- SEMINAR DATES:
 - Session 1: Thurs 2/12 (Intro and Learning Climate)
 - Session 2: Thurs 2/19 (Control of Session)
 - Session 3: Thurs 3/5 (Communication of Goals)
 - Session 4: Thurs 3/19 (Promotion of Understanding and Retention)
 - Session 5: Thurs 4/2 (Evaluation)
 - Session 6: Thurs 4/16 (Feedback)
 - Session 7: Thurs 4/30 (Promotion of Self-Directed Learning)
 - Session 8: Thurs 5/14 (Debrief and Wrap-up)





Applications, Selection Process, Expectations:

- \bullet APPLICATION: Submit CV, complete application online by deadline (Tues 12/19/25)
- SELECTION PROCESS: Application review based on criteria above. Selected participants will be notified by January 7th
- COMMITMENT: Upon acceptance, submit the acceptance form to confirm participation
 - Supervisor signature is required
 - o Deadline to confirm participation is January 14, 2026
 - o Commit to attending all sessions as scheduled (Thurs 1-3 pm on dates above)
- REQUIREMENTS for Participants: Attend /actively-participate in ALL sessions complete post session surveys, end of training survey and goals document
- ATTENDANCE POLICY: Must attend all sessions to receive certificate
- COMPLETION: Program completion CERTIFICATE, CV Citation
