Clinical Educator – Access and Engagement (1.0 FTE) UAB Employment Site #T227138

SUMMARY:

The School of Nursing Office of Access and Engagement (SONOAE) Clinical Educator role develops and supports community outreach, education, and other programming that supports the access and engagement mission of the SONOAE. Reporting to the Associate Dean of Access and Engagement for UAB School of Nursing, the Clinical Educator (CE) collaborates with the SON community (faculty, staff, students), UAB departments, and community members to plan and implement learning and engagement experiences that support the strategic priorities of the SONOAE. The CE will collaborate with appropriate personnel within the School of Nursing (SON) to ensure course and programs developed for community and campus learners by the SONOAE align and compliment the initiatives of the pre-licensure CEs. Duties include supervision of students on and off campus, developing and teaching elective courses, and the coordination of activities that support the learning needs of students who participate in SONOAE education initiatives. This individual will collaborate with faculty across disciplines, community partners, UABSON faculty and staff to ensure seamless coordination of programs. This is not a faculty position. This is not a remote position.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Responsibilities are outlined for on campus initiatives and community.

On Campus Initiatives

- Collaborate with Office of Student Success, Student Success Champions, Simulation Lab Staff, and others as needed, to plan and execute opportunities to engage community, pre-nursing, and other interested students in activities at the SON.
- Collaborates with SONOAE Program Manager-II, and other personnel as appropriate to develop and implement programs that support SONOAE strategic priorities.
- Develops and provides academic instruction in assigned courses.
- Coordinates seminars and other educational experiences for students interested in nursing.
- Participates in the management of supplies and equipment inventory for SONOAE activities.

- Currently licensed or licensed by endorsement as a Registered Nurse (RN) by the Alabama Board of Nursing required.
