

he Department of Health Services Administration embodies its values of collaboration, integrity, respect and excellence and these stories exemplify the values in action through the time, talent and treasure of our students, alumni, and faculty. The MSHA Program remained #1 in the recently-released 2025 US News & World Report rankings of all graduate programs in healthcare management across the country. This outstanding accomplishment reflects the commitment of UAB faculty, students, and alumni. The MSHA program has steadily moved up in the rankings over the past 15 years - advancing from #7 in 2009 to #5 in 2011 to #2 in 2015, and #1 in 2019, 2023 and again in 2025. The ranking



is an acknowledgment of our commitment to provide an outstanding learning experience that includes excellent education, practice-relevant scholarly activity, and engaged

alumni. It means so much to the department because it is recognition from our peers and because it highlights a legacy of excellence at UAB that began 60 years ago.

# Case Competitions

he 19th Annual UAB Health Administration Case Competition, sponsored by UAB Medicine, tasked teams to focus on implementing facility-specific environmental sustainability initiatives that align with AdventHealth's strategic priorities and operational constraints. The 41 teams developed a three-year, localized environmental sustainability plan across one of six facilities.



The case architects, Natalie Hamilton and Rob Roy, pushed the teams to delve into how sustainability impacts health and healthcare in one of the defined facilities. Teams assessed which facility (of the six listed below) they would select for their recommendations and the numbers next to the facility's name indicate how many times each facility was selected.

We were very fortunate to have the "rock stars and voices of sustainability" serve as judges - thanks to Dr. Andrew Garman (Rush University) and Dr. Anthony Stanowski (former President/CEO of CAHME), who connected us with judges whose expertise provided excellent feedback to the teams.

The first, second, and third place teams received cash awards at the final ceremony and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill won the 19th UAB Health Administration Case Competition. Finishing second was **Medical University of South Carolina** (MUSC) and placing third was University of Minnesota.

They provided recommendations to Hershey Medical Center with a comprehensive, innovative strategy to improve nurse satisfaction and reduce turnover through a customized benefits package.

MUSC CASE COMPETITION: The team of Henna Noohani, Michael Pham, and Avery Wiles was tasked with developing a comprehensive, financially sustainable business model for an Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome (EDS) Institute at the Medical University of South Carolina. Their proposal focused on integrating multidisciplinary specialties—including neurology, cardiology, genetics, gastroenterology, and psychiatry—into

> a single coordinated care model designed to improve diagnostic timelines, patient outcomes, and care accessibility for individuals living with hypermobile EDS (hEDS).

They presented a plan to expand the existing infrastructure at MUSC's Hollings Cancer Center into a designated EDS Center of Excellence, leveraging telehealth capabilities, rural hospital partnerships, and federal and academic collaborations to deliver accessible, patient-centered care. Their model emphasized improved continuity of care, operational efficiency, and a scalable telehealth system designed to reach underserved communities across South Carolina.



# Faculty Research Updates



DR. MONICA ASWANI'S research centers on how health care payment and delivery reform impacts access to and quality of care, particularly for populations from marginalized backgrounds. Her work primarily focuses on

the evaluation of health policies, with an emphasis on their distributional effects and unintended consequences.

In one study, conducted in collaboration with Dr. Paul Shafer of Boston University and published in JAMA Health Forum, Dr. Aswani examined historical changes in the Medicaid personal needs allowance. This monthly stipend allows Medicaid beneficiaries residing in nursing homes to retain a portion of their income for personal items such as clothing, snacks, cell phones, and toiletries. The analysis highlighted that the federal floor for this allowance—set at \$30 per month nearly four decades ago—has remained

unchanged in some states, including Alabama, failing to keep pace with the real cost of personal expenses for nursing home residents.

Another paper, published in *Health Affairs*, analyzed commercial health insurance claims to assess the use of Z codes introduced in the tenth revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10) to document social determinants of health. The findings showed that while Z code usage remains limited, their prevalence doubled between 2016 and 2022. Utilization varied significantly by state, domain, and age group. Importantly, the analysis revealed that average annual health care spending for individuals with Z codes was more than twice that of individuals without them.

Together, these studies underscore the critical need for more agile and responsive infrastructures to support safety-net programs, particularly for vulnerable populations.

The Department had two faculty members who received grants from the School of Health Professions: Research Pilot: Monica Aswani: "Effects of Section 1115 Waivers to Eliminate Retroactive Medicaid" Education Innovation: Leandra Celaya: "Developing a high reliability certificate program to expand interprofessional continuing education offerings in SHP"

DR. SOUMYA NIRANJAN focuses her research on advancing equitable access to lung cancer screening through implementation science and community-engaged approaches. Her work addresses barriers to screening at multiple levels—individual, community, and health system—with a particular emphasis on populations across the Southeastern United States who experience persistent obstacles to preventive care. Her scholarship reflects the department's mission to improve health outcomes through evidence-based policy, systems-level change, and collaborative practice. She currently leads several federally funded initiatives that demonstrate both methodological innovation and strong partnerships with healthcare systems and community organizations.

As Principal Investigator of the "Community-centered Lung cancer screening and Awareness" (CLARA) project, Dr. Niranjan is using concept mapping to co-develop culturally relevant educational strategies designed to increase awareness of lung cancer screening. This work is notable for centering community voices in the design of public health interventions.

Building on this foundation, she was recently awarded a second grant from the National Cancer Institute for the "Lung cancer screening Awareness Targeted and Tailored to Increase screening" (LATTICE) project. This study will design and test tailored interventions aimed at increasing screening among individuals at high risk for lung cancer. She also leads a project supported by UAB's Center for Clinical and Translational Science focused on developing implementation strategies to reduce disparities within clinical settings, thereby linking community insights to systemic

improvements in healthcare delivery.

Dr. Niranjan's recent publications reflect the practical impact of her research. A 2024 study in Cancer Causes & Control documented significant disparities in lung cancer screening across two major health systems, while a 2024 article in Cancer Medicine evaluated a community-based education initiative that increased screening awareness and intent. Her publication in the Journal of Cancer Education demonstrated the effectiveness of training Community Health



Advisors in Alabama's Black Belt to deliver lung cancer education—an approach that has since been adapted by other rural initiatives.



Over the past year, DR. ERIN **BLANCHARD'S** research and scholarly activities have centered on advancing simulation-based education, exploring the impact

of virtual reality (VR) on learner stress response, and expanding the methodological approaches used in simulation scholarship. She delivered two invited Sim Series webinars for the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH), one focused on professional development through the SSH Member Roadmap and the other highlighting innovations in virtual reality for healthcare.

Dr. Blanchard's research efforts resulted in several peer-reviewed publications spanning a diverse set of simulation-related topics. These include a systematic review examining conditions before and after teamwork training and their effects on skills transfer to the clinical setting, a novel application of text mining to explore trends in simulation literature, and empirical work evaluating VR-based stress inoculation training. She also co-authored studies in telehealth implementation, cybersecurity simulation education, and wellness initiatives in medical training. Notably, her ongoing research on VR and stress response in physician associate students was supported by a UAB Education Innovation Grant, for which she served as principal investigator.

Dr. Blanchard's work was presented at both national and international conferences, including IMSH 2025, the 19th International Congress on Quality in Healthcare in Turkey, and SESAM 2024 in Prague. These presentations focused on simulation scholarship, leadership development, and the use of text mining in healthcare education research.

Collectively, her scholarly contributions reflect a sustained commitment to advancing simulation pedagogy, promoting research-informed practices, and expanding the role of emerging technologies in health professions education. She remains engaged in collaborative, interdisciplinary research that informs curriculum design and supports learner development across clinical, academic, and organizational contexts.



## Dr. Seung-Yup "Joshua" Lee's current research centers on four core areas.

### 1) Al-Driven Risk Stratification for Patients with Diabetes:

Dr. Lee focuses on diabetes care in the Deep South, particularly among socioeconomically disadvantaged populations in Jefferson County, Alabama. In the past year, he has led two intramural grants in this area: the Center for Clinical and Translational Science (CCTS) Partner Network Pilot Program and the Forge AHEAD Center Pilot Program Grant at UAB. This work has led to recent publications, including in JMIR Research Protocols.

### 2) Social Determinants of Health and Disparities Analysis: Dr. Lee applies predictive AI, machine learning, and econometric meth-

ods to analyze patient- and hospital-level data. His contributions in this area have been published in journals such as Journal of American Medical Informatics Association (JAMIA) and Health Care Management Review.

#### 3) Care Transitions and

Continuity: In collaboration with UAB's Center for Outcomes and Effectiveness Research and Education (COERE), Dr. Lee has evaluated care transition initiatives with a focus on continuity between acute and primary care. His use of statistical and machine learning techniques to assess appointment adherence and outcomes during care transitions has resulted in publications in The Journal of Ambulatory Care Management and JAMIA Open.

#### 4) Compassionate Care

**Documentation:** Dr. Lee's recent interdisciplinary project in palliative care uses natural language processing to explore whether clinical documentation can be more compassionate and whether such documentation improves communication and outcomes. He received the UAB Palliative Research Enhancement Project (PREP) Award from the Center for Palliative and Supportive Care. He also co-organizes a symposium on AI for Organizational and Behavioral Constructs at the 2025 Academy of Management Annual Meeting in Copenhagen.



DR. WEI LYU'S research focuses on how public policies influence access to health care and health outcomes for vulnerable populations. His work leverages large

national datasets and quasi-experimental research designs to address actionable, policy-relevant questions for Medicaid agencies, safety-net providers, and stakeholders in maternal and child health.

Over the past year, Dr. Lyu has examined the effects of pandemic-era policies on health care utilization and population health. This includes evaluating income support measures such as Economic Impact Payments, the expanded Child Tax Credit, and the enhanced Earned Income Tax Credit. as well as the continuous Medicaid coverage provisions enacted under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act. In a study published in the Journal of Health Economics, he and his co-authors analyzed how additional income from the expanded Child Tax Credit and pandemic stimulus checks affected infant health outcomes and found no significant


overall effects. His recent work, published in *Health* Services Research and INQUIRY, explored the impact of continuous Medicaid coverage during the COVID-19 public health emergency. These studies identified improvements in insurance continuity and access to care, underscoring the potential value of policy-driven coverage stability.

In addition, Dr. Lyu serves as a co-investigator on an NIH-funded R03 project examining the spillover effects of Medicaid dental coverage expansions. A recent paper from this project, published in Medical Care, reported modest yet meaningful improvements in self-reported health measures following these expansions.

Dr. Lyu's research collectively highlights the nuanced and varied effects of public policy on health care access and outcomes, emphasizing the importance of evidence-based policy design for improving health equity among vulnerable populations.



**GEOFFREY SILVE-**RA, PHD, MHA, has been named Program Director for the graduate pro-



To honor Dr. Hernandez and ensure his enduring influence on the department, we have established the Dr. S. Robert Hernandez Endowed Faculty Scholar. This



# Executive MSHA Students Experience International Healthcare in Italy

Students from MSHA Class E59 traveled to Rome, Italy, for their international health system visit in April 2025. Over the course of six days, they engaged in a rich, immersive experience designed to deepen their understanding of global healthcare delivery and policy.

The itinerary included a joint case study with Italian Executive MSHA students at Policlinico Agostino Gemelli Hospital, guided tours of historic hospitals such as Santo Spirito and San Carlo di Nancy, and a seminar on telemedicine at the National Agency for Regional Health Services (AGENAS). Students also met with leaders from Farmindustria and the Italian Ministry of Health and participated in a full-day excursion to the Casentino region to explore integrated care in a rural setting.

This international experience reflects the program's commitment to developing globally minded health-care leaders. We are grateful to our university partners and to the many professionals who welcomed our students, sharing their time, expertise, and insights into the Italian healthcare system.







# **UAB** Italian Partnership

In alignment with the Department of Health Services Administration's strategic pillar of global impact, Dr. Phil Cendoma began cultivating a relationship with ALTEMS, Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, during the 2023 Academy of Management conference, where he connected with faculty members Luca Giorgio, Federica Morandi, and Roberta Laurita. What began as a professional introduction has since evolved into a robust international partnership.

Following that initial meeting, Dr. Cendoma has delivered several presentations at Università Cattolica in Rome, further strengthening academic ties between institutions. In fall 2024, Luca Giorgio visited UAB as a guest lecturer, and in spring 2025, the department welcomed two of ALTEMS' PhD students to Birmingham to engage with faculty and students. Additionally, in February, Federica Morandi and Roberta Laurita visited UAB as visiting scholars, presenting their work and experiencing UAB's academic environment firsthand.

The collaboration continued this summer as Dr. Cendoma, Dr. J'Aime Jennings, and Dr. Christy Harris Lemak each delivered lectures in Rome—further expanding UAB's international presence in health services education.





# **EURAM**

The 2025 EUROPEAN ACADEMY OF MANAGEMENT (EURAM) was held in Florence, Italy and hosted by Università degli Studi di Firenze. Global coverage on healthcare management topics is always a highlight.
